YPN served **1811** parents, children & youth.

This includes **202** parents, **156** prental moms and **226** children.

In FY17, the average participant age for YPN parents was **19.5**.

Each year we help families learn ways to become stronger while setting goals, being accountable, and preparing their youth for school.

YPN is a **vital** piece of our community as it is the only program that offers **comprehensive** services and resources for children age 0-5.

Michelle came to YPN a month after she turned 14. She and the father of her child attended Thursday night group sessions during her pregnancy but stopped during her third trimester. When Levi was born, he tested positive for marijuana, which prompted DHS to open an investigation. At the lowest point in her journey, Levi was removed from Michelle's care. Her case was on the verge of being closed, and her rights terminated, when she decided to come back to YPN.

Michelle now attends group regularly, and has become friends with other young moms, and best of all she now has Levi in her care full time. Levi is testing above average developmentally, and their DHS case will be officially closed in the next couple of months.

Michelle continues to work so hard on being the best parent she can be to her young son, and for that she greatly appreciates YPN. Volunteers fill a critical need for YPN on a daily basis. From childcare during weekly group night, to reading with youth, to working in the We Care Shop. The difference these individuals make in the lives of our participants is priceless!

Eastern Iowa Health Center + YPN We Care Shop = The Eastern Iowa Diaper Bank

Diapers are a basic need for babies' health and well-being, yet for many families, diapers are financially difficult. On average, a monthly supply of diapers can cost \$80 per month, for a family living on a limited income, these high costs often mean deciding between paying for food and utilities or paying for diapers.

YPN is proud to collaborate with EIHC in an effort to provide diapers to local families in need.



We Care Shop & Eastern Iowa Diaper Bank

The We Care Shop is an incentive based "store" that is run by volunteers. Shelves are stocked with essential items such as clothes, diapers, basic care products and much more, all donated by our generous community!



In FY17,

Over 1,897 visits occurred at the We Care Shop

And, over 70,000 diapers were distributed

Collaboration is key to the success of YPN programming. For the third straight year, YPN, in partnership with Youthport, offered the following programs to encourage parents to read with their children, help address summer learning loss and to build the literacy skills necessary for youth to enter school prepared.

Ready to Read

- 444 families & children came together for a meal and reading
- 34 volunteers shared helpful ways parents can use books to build confidence in their child
- 375+ books were read to
 223 youth

Lunch & Literacy

- 78 volunteers read with over
- 100+ youth during the summer months at a variety of locations
- 261+ hours of reading, with
 - 1090+ books read, and each child chose a book of their own to take home

Currently, over **10 languages** can be heard spoken at YPN any given day. **YPN embraces diversity.**

During FY17, YPN introduced a new and successful Juntos program, working with **28 youth** and **26 parents** to offer college planning tips, provide information on the importance of family communication and helping find ways to prepare students for their futures.

YPN has also implemented a multilingual African Moms Program, with our first class recognizing 15 moms who successfully completed the curriculum.
