A LEGACY OF VISION

Brian Stutzman joined the staff of YPN in 1997 as the Dad's Program Manager. Three years later, he was the Executive Director and began an 18-year journey that would guide the agency forward into a bright future of positive change and growth, while maintaining a sharp focus on mission.

Brian was a **passionate and stalwart advocate for underserved populations in our community** and served as an **exceptional example of what it means to be a community partner**. His gregarious personality coupled with his passion for meeting the needs of the community enabled him to help establish several impactful initiatives. Under his leadership the We Care Shop has grown from a tiny lending closet to a fully stocked incentive program that rivals some retail spaces. Brian was a significant part of the creation and implementation of the Eastern Iowa Diaper Bank which in its first two years has given out over 247,300 diapers. Further, during his tenure, Brian helped create YouthPort, a collaboration between YPN, Boys & Girls Clubs of Cedar Rapids and Tanager Place, that collectively serves youth in our area.

Without a doubt, Brian's absence will be felt by family, friends, colleagues and community partners for years to come. He left behind a very special legacy that is weaved throughout the programs and services of YPN. As we reflect on the past fiscal year, we pause to remember a member of our team who infused passion, positivity and

compassion into everything he did.

And now, as we look toward the future, we remain focused on our mission and are committed to building upon a foundation of excellence. **YPN is proud of the work we do** and of the legacies left behind, in addition to those that continue to be built today. THE FAMILIES OF YPN

For more than 32 years, YPN has been providing prenatal and parenting support to those with children ages 0-5. Our core programming serves the entire family with consistent and comprehensive education. YPN is proud to help families become stronger while supporting them with goal setting, accountability and preparing children to become school-ready.



Kyle & Athena's YPN Story

A few months after graduating high school, Athena met Kyle, fell in love, and soon became pregnant. The couple immediately began attending YPN prenatal programming on a weekly basis until the birth of their son, Aidrian. They then got married and successfully transitioned forward into other YPN groups that focused on newborns through the preschool years. Although there were times when life presented struggles – whether it was housing, employment or financial instability – they continued to be involved with YPN and committed to becoming the best parents they could be. Within a few short years, Kyle and Athena both found better employment and eventually were able to purchase their own home. Early this year, they welcomed their second son, Jacob, and in May the family graduated from the YPN program.

YPN is so proud of this family, and the many others like them, who commit to making a better life for themselves and their children. Kyle and



Athena are an example of what can happen with just a little bit of support, encouragement and perseverance. The couple are forever a part of the YPN story and often serve as mentors to other participants. Their future is bright!

THE WE CARE SHOP

The YPN We Care Shop is an incentive based store where families involved with YPN can purchase items with points earned through participating in programming. This incentive program allows families to earn points in a variety of ways; attending group meetings, going to

prenatal visits, receiving their high school diploma or HiSET, getting their child immunized on schedule, accessing counseling, and many other healthy behavior choices for themselves and their families.





Jean & Glenda's YPN Story

This year, YPN said goodbye to two of our long time volunteers. Jean and Glenda have been washing clothing, sorting donations, cleaning & displaying toys and assisting visitors in The We Care Shop since shortly after the doors first opened in 1993. Their dedication and commitment to serving families has been an inspiration and we will miss seeing their



smiling faces each week. Thank you, Jean and Glenda, for being a huge part of the YPN story.

MEETING THE NEED

YPN remains committed to meeting the needs of an ever-changing demographic by offering programs designed specifically for diverse populations. As the Latino and African populations have increased in our community, YPN has responded by offering services and programs



that are mission-driven and inclusive. We are fortunate to be able to offer multi-lingual programming because of tremendous support from local individuals and organizations who understand the importance of embracing diversity and responding to change.

In FY18 we served **104 moms + 117 children** in our African & Hispanic programs.

Minouche's YPN Story

YPN is excited to welcome Minouche Bandubuila to the team! Minouche arrived in Iowa in 2008 pregnant, alone and barely able to speak English. Life was hard enough as a mother on her own, but it was made even more difficult because of a lack of community support. Today, Minouche is devoted to helping others, especially African moms who benefit from her



experience.

As a facilitator in YPN's Parent Café's, Minouche helps educate African mothers and assists them in getting acclimated to a new culture here in Cedar Rapids. Now in its second year, she is seeing much progress within the group, such as moms going to school, taking better care of themselves and their families, and overall looking at life in a more positive way.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Collaboration has always been key to the success of YPN programming. Over the past several years, YPN has enjoyed a strong partnership with several other local human service agencies that help expand our reach into the community. By sharing resources and referrals, the organizations that make up YouthPort are able to provide multi-service programming and support more families. Programs like Ready to Read and Lunch & Literacy bring together families, volunteers and youth for a meal and quality reading time. These critical offerings help combat summer slide and get preschool age kids school ready.

EVENTS & FUNDRAISING

Operation Diaper Drive

is a city-wide event to benefit the Eastern Iowa Diaper Bank. In its second year, the drive collected over 140,000 diapers! Many sponsors helped support the cause by hosting collection boxes at their locations through the month of October. Thousands of diapers are distributed to local families through incentive programs.

GENERATIONAL IMPACT

Rosa began utilizing YPN's services in 2014 when her daughter was a year old. She wanted to make a better life for herself and her daughter but faced several barriers.

"I was told there was no way I could ever go to college, so I said to myself, maybe this is impossible. I am a single mom, I do have a young child, and I do not have the money to go to school. Maybe there was no way to achieve my dreams. But I continued to attend YPN, and I continued to work, and with the support of YPN and the people who supported YPN and me, I could possibly do it."

In 2010, a donor family of YPN created a scholarship that is awarded yearly to a participant who has the desire to further their education. Receiving the **"Reach for the Stars"** scholarship removed a major barrier for Rosa and allowed her to begin creating the life she envisioned. Now, she gives back by serving as a volunteer facilitator at group.

"I tell other people if you do better with your life, maybe you will be able to help others. Because that is what happens- it's like a chain. You do something and maybe that next person in front of you is going to do something else, and maybe the person following your step is going to do the same. It creates a chain of people helping people."

"I would not have been able to achieve what I am achieving now without the help of others, and YPN. Somebody did for me what I can do for other human beings moving forward. I will be grateful my whole life to YPN and the generous donor family because they have opened the door I thought was closed. Now I see life in a different way, and I know there are good people in this world. Even if they don't know you, they care about you."



Rosa recently completed two years at Kirkwood Community College graduating with Academic Excellence Honors and is now attending The University of Iowa.
