A NEW SPACE FOR BUILDING BRIGHT FUTURES

Our primary program model, Building Bright Futures, has always had in-person group education and support at its core. As part of a long term program, participants of YPN come to rely heavily on the relationships built with staff and each other to help them as they navigate life and parenthood.

After many years conducting programming at Polk Alternative Education Center, YPN's growing Thursday night services required a larger space. Our traditional evening groups began utilizing facilities at Stonebridge Church beginning in the summer of 2019. The building provides several amenities that offer a modern and comfortable learning space for participants, staff, and volunteers.

STAYING CONNECTED

In early 2020, YPN was faced with a unique challenge as it became necessary to lock down due to the Covid-19 disruption. As in other times of upheaval, the organization has been nimble, flexible, and creative in response and remains mission-focused. With professionalism and compassion, YPN staff work diligently and resourcefully to provide virtual support to participants.

Though in-person meetings are ideal, virtual programming allows staff to reach more people. Those interested in the education and services YPN provides can tune in on Thursday nights or watch the video later when it is most convenient for them.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: HOME VISITS

Funding through Early Childhood of Iowa (ECI) allows YPN to offer in-home parent education and family support as an alternative to group services. Jan Moffitt, Home Visitation Program Manager, says this option benefits both participants and staff because it allows the formation of a much stronger bond with the entire family unit in their own space.

HOME VISIT HIGHLIGHTS:

Offered twice per month for one hour
Centered on parent-child learning
Focused on core child development areas
Utilizes the "Parents As Teachers" evidence-based curriculum
Assists families with goal-setting and progress tracking

As social distance and mask mandates remain in place, home visits have continued with staff meeting families outside their homes or at a nearby park. If an alternative location is not available, sessions take place virtually or by phone.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: PRENATAL SERVICES

YPN prenatal program staff and volunteers provide critical education and support to expecting and new parents during a time in their lives that is often filled with wonder and excitement, but can also bring feelings of anxiousness and confusion. Programming focuses on healthy behaviors during pregnancy and creating a delivery plan.

PRENATAL & NEWBORN GROUP HIGHLIGHTS:

Supportive groups include expecting and newborn parents
Focused on healthy pregnancy, delivery plan, and newborn care
Post-partum visit and assessment

Support for mom and dad as they make the transition into parenthood Utilizes the "Parents As Teachers" evidence-based curriculum

During the Covid-19 pandemic, our Prenatal Specialist and trained facilitators utilize virtual methods of program delivery to continue to offer moms and dads **support**, **education**, and **empowerment** throughout the early stages of parenthood and child development.



In FY20, YPN served 74 moms and dads, with 48 post-partum visits, and 27 babies born.

EASTERN IOWA DIAPER BANK

YPN is proud to be a founding partner and the physical location of the Eastern Iowa Diaper Bank (EIDB). Along with our colleagues and partners at the Eastern Iowa Health Center, this collaboration serves one simple purpose: to provide families in need with diapers. The low-income families both agencies serve can spend nearly 14% of their paycheck on diapers. As a member of the National Diaper Bank Network (NDBN), the EIDB helps to safeguard one of the most basic needs of all babies and their families – access to clean, dry diapers.

Thanks to the support of the NDBN, local foundations and corporations, and individual community donors, the EIDB has been able to respond to community need and provide essential services to clients of YPN, the Eastern Iowa Health Center and, most recently, HACAP/WIC.



WE CARE SHOP & VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

The YPN We Care Shop is an incentive program that allows families to earn points in a variety of ways: attending group meetings, going to prenatal visits, receiving their high school diploma or HiSET, attending scheduled well-child exams, and many other healthy behavior choices. Points earned by parents can then be redeemed at the We Care Shop for basic needs items such as diapers and clothing for their children. The shelves in the Shop are stocked with items generously donated by community members and is operated by staff and volunteers.


